GCSE Art and Design

What does it involve?

- 3 main projects.
- Year 9: Foundation
- (learning and beginning to build portfolio ideas for one year)
- Year 10: Coursework
- (building a portfolio and taking a mock exam)
- Year 11: Portfolio work and Exam....
- (20 hours of preparation in sessions and a 10 hour final exam!)

The Foundation Stage

- This stage is designed to increase learners' <u>confidence</u>
 <u>and capability</u> with a range of media and techniques,
 (including painting and drawing, sculpture, printmaking and alternative media)
- It introduces them to the concept of keeping a sketchbook as a visual journey
- ♦ It begins to develop learners' understanding of the assessment objectives in Art and Design


Coursework...60%

- ▲ Learners develop a portfolio during cohort 9 and 10 and refine it in the early part of cohort 11. This builds on their earlier practice and continues to develop their skills and understanding.
- Learners are expected to continue to develop work using a variety of media and are required to produce outcomes in at least two disciplines.


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Sketchbook work is key...

for exploring, researching and experimenting




Work is produced in lots of different ways, learners are encouraged to make their own choices about this..



We encourage learners to take influence from a wide variety of sources, including galleries and museums, to support their studies and we always try to run at least two visits during the course of the GCSE. Previous visits for have included a residential in Paris and visits to most of the key London galleries









Final exam...40%

- Learners are given an selection of externally set titles for their final investigations and piece
- ◆ They are given 20 hours of classroom time to investigate the theme before producing a final piece during a 10 hour 'exam'.

Finally.. learners display their work for grading and invite parents to a private view to celebrate their achievements











Who will thrive in Art GCSE

- Learners who genuinely ENJOY the subject
- Learners who like to challenge themselves and be creative
- Learners who are prepared to keep trying and exploring even when things sometimes go wrong
- Learners who are prepared to work for <u>at</u> least one hour a week at home and who can focus in class

- Art learners open A-level and BTEC options such as Photography, Film, Architecture, History of Art, Graphics, Textiles, Media, Product design and many more to themselves. Many of these courses REQUIRE an art GCSE.
- We have art learners going on to courses at Colchester 6th form, Colchester Institute, CRGS, KEGS and even some London courses.
